Other features include the Auckland University of Technology campus at Northcote and the iconic Chelsea Sugar Refinery at Birkenhead.

Kaipātiki Local Board

He kõrero mõ ngā poari ā-rohe About local boards

Local boards provide governance at the local level within Auckland Council. They enable democratic decision-making on behalf of communities within each local board area.

There are 21 local boards with between five and nine members elected to each board. Auckland has a total of 149 local board members.

Local boards:

- Make decisions about local issues, activities and services
- Contribute to regional strategies, policies, plans and decisions.

Responsibilities of local boards

Local boards:

- Adopt local board plans. These set the strategic direction for the local board area every three years in consultation with their communities
- Work with the Governing Body to set local board agreements and annual budgets
- Agree and oversee annual work programmes. They also:
- Provide local leadership and develop relationships with the community, community organisations and special interest groups in the local area
- Make decisions on local matters, including events, parks, community programmes and local fees and charges
- · Oversee facilities in the local board area
- Identify and develop bylaws for their local board area and propose them to the Governing Body



- Identify and communicate the views of local people on regional strategies, policies, plans and bylaws to the Governing Body
- Advise the Governing Body about any regional decisions that affect the local board area
- Make decisions on any additional responsibilities delegated by the Governing Body, such as decisions for regional bylaws
- Contribute to plans and initiatives for council-controlled organisations (CCOs).

Kaipātiki's suburbs are well established. Northcote and Birkenhead Points are renowned for their built heritage.

There are also a number of heritage sites important to Māori, such as the pā at Stokes Point.

The area has 530ha of reserves and walkways.

The area is ethnically diverse with over a quarter of the population identifying as Asian, approximately 8.5 per cent Māori and just under 6 per cent Pasifika.

Amenities in the Kaipātiki Local Board area Kaipātiki has three main town centres

- Birkenhead, Glenfield and Northcote - complemented by smaller local centres.


Twenty nine per cent of the population work within the board boundary with the Wairau Valley commercial industrial area being one centre of employment.

The North Shore campus of AUT University is located on Akoranga Drive, Northcote.

Major leisure venues include the North Shore Events Centre and the Netball North Harbour complex.

The Chelsea Estate Heritage Park and Sugar Refinery along with Shoal Bay provide stunning coastal views and a cityscape of central Auckland.

Championing the Kaipātiki Way

KCFT Steps to Success

The KCFT Steps to Success Programme is a holistic, thorough, and in-depth set of Skill Modules which are designed to build the self-esteem, resilience, and confidence of rangatahi before they transition into supported employment.

The KCFT Programme provide rangatahi, and their whānau, with a firm foundation prior to the transition into the workforce, and additional support once they find employment.

Rangatahi embarking on this journey are expected to commit to full participation in all scheduled modules and workshops. These work in partnership with, not only the rangatahi, but also their whānau and other applicable service providers.

It is a 6 month programme, with the following modules:





KCFT Steps to Success Team



Months 1 - 4 Resilience Module

Rangatahi (in partnership with their whānau and any relevant service providers) embark on a journey of self-discovery with their KCFT Steps to Success staff member. Whilst on this programme, youth develop their own 'Who Am I' portfolio, building resilience and confidence within themselves.

Rangatahi will build their own personalized visual Curriculum Vitae (CV) and receive tailored support as they navigate through the process of job seeking alongside KCFT Steps to Success (i.e.: Cover Letters, Interview Skills).

The Steps to Success Programme has dedicated counsellors and personal trainers available, who rangatahi will be invited to work with during the ongoing sessions. The Steps to Success Programme also has a selection of workshops which rangatahi will attend.

Months 5 - 6 Work Experience Module

Once rangatahi find an employment industry of interest, KCFT Steps to Success will job match them with an appropriate employer in that industry, and support them through the on-boarding process (job interviews, documentation etc`).

Rangatahi will be placed with employers who have partnered with KCFT Steps to Success. These employers work with the needs and development of rangatahi, to ensure a streamlined transition, while rangatahi work up to a 40 hour week/fulltime work.

After month 6 going forward - Pastoral Care Module

Once rangatahi commence paid employment, they will transition onto the Pastoral Care Module.

This is youth-led support, like they receive in the Work Experience Module, and is centered on the on-going career development of the rangatahi as they create a firm foundation within their new workplace.

KCFT Attendance Services

KCFT Attendance Services initially works with schools to identify at risk students who may have a high level of chronic absences, then work with family/ whānau to build a cooperative solution that provides on-going support and encouragement to help those students achieve more positive outcomes from their learning journey.

Our KCFT Attendance Navigators assist rangatahi to get the support they need to get back into school, or alternative education. In some cases, supportive employment programmes such as Steps to Success are the solution.

Working alongside other agencies in the area, and utilising our strong community support networks, we put plans and strategies in place to improve school attendance.

Attending school on a regular basis is hugely important.

Every day counts towards a child's learning and pays huge dividends for their future.

KCFT Attendance Services Team

Walking alongside our tamariki, rangatahi and their whānau to help them back into education

Major components of the KCFT Attendance Services Programme

- Attendance programmes are the responsibility of the whole community, and not just that of schools, parents or the courts. This point, and other principles for preventing chronic absences from school, are highlighted in a variety of independent research studies.
- Our Tool Kit is about promoting schools and community engagement, as well as more effective school attendance policies.
- It also provides a range of action plans to create alternatives to student out-of-school suspension and expulsion.
- School governance models also benefit from KCFT Attendance Navigators providing professional support, training and much more.

What we provide schools

 A continuum of supports, including meaningful incentives for good attendance and consequences for poor attendance.

- Collaboration among community groups such as law enforcement, mental health workers, mentors, and social service providers in addition to educators.
- Concrete and measurable goals for programme performance and student performance. Good record keeping and ongoing evaluation of progress toward those goals.
- Parent/guardian involvement, along with whānau/family involvement as required.

What we provide together

- A service that re-integrates students into the education system or further learning.
- A service that extends beyond returning the learner back to school but addresses all the factors contributing to a learner's chronic absences or non-enrolment and identifies what school, whānau, community or social service support is required.

Kaipātiki Youth

Kaipātiki Local Youth Board

The Kaipātiki Local Youth Board provides opportunities for young people in Kaipātiki to get involved in the community, and have the voice of youth in local decision making processes.

It also means being part of the local consultation process with the Kaipātiki Local Board and other local and central government agencies.

Most importantly, the Kaipātiki Local Youth Board allows our youth to engage with others their same age at a decision-making level, and to engage with elected officials and politicians to provide events, or projects for youth lead by youth.

Children's and Student Panels

These panels, started six years ago, have provided an opportunity for young people to have a voice in specific areas each school term throughout the year, working collaboratively with agencies and/or our Local Board. Schools involved include Birkenhead, Glenfield and Northcote High Schools, Birkdale, Glenfield and Northcote Intermediate Schools and identified local primary schools.

A snapshot of the issues covered include: Pest Free Kaipātiki, Youth Health, Transport, Safety in the Community, Watersafe, Library Hours, Connected Kaipātiki.

Kaipātiki Youth Development Trust (KYDT) is an MSD Level 2 approved community social service provider based in the Kaipātiki area. We offer mentoring and social work support for at-risk young people aged 12 to 17, working closely with both the young person and their whānau to achieve positive outcomes.



With a strong and proven track record in the community, KYDT has supported countless young people facing complex and often challenging situations. Our team comprises trained, experienced, and culturally competent staff dedicated to helping rangatahi discover their strengths, build resilience, and thrive.

KYDT delivers both individualised and group-based programmes using a strength-based, youth-centred approach. Our programmes cover a range of important topics, including:

- · Goal setting
- · Building self-esteem
- · Managing anger and emotions
- · Improving self-confidence
- Understanding choices and consequences
- Developing resilience and coping strategies

Young people who participate in our programmes often show measurable improvements in:

- · Self-awareness and self-respect
- · Positive peer and adult relationships
- · Coping with bullying and social pressure
- · Motivation and future planning
- · Emotional literacy and regulation

We also provide experiential learning opportunities, including structured activities that promote team-building, trust, and personal growth.

KYDT's Kaupapa is grounded in the principle of early intervention—offering guidance and better pathways before serious issues escalate. A guiding whakataukī that shapes our work is:

"If we dislike young people's choices, perhaps we need to provide them with better options from which to choose."
